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ASSOCIATION FOR MANUSCRIPTS AND ARCHIVES IN RESEARCH COLLECTIONS

At a meeting at the School of Oriental and African Studies on 17 December 1992, the constitution and name of the new Association (successor to the former Manuscripts Group of the SCONUL Advisory Committee on Manuscripts and Archives) were agreed. The following were elected to the Association's Committee: Dr Ian Doyle, Durham University Library, Chairman; Dr Rowan Watson, V&A, Secretary (for 6 months) and joint Newsletter Editor; Dr Scot McKendrick, British Library, Treasurer; Dr Jenny Stratford (Newsletter Editor); Dr Bernard Meehan, Trinity College, Dublin; Dr Timothy Hobbs, Glasgow University Library; Alan Piper, Durham University; Mary Clapinson, Bodleian Library, Oxford; T.A.J. Burnett, Manuscripts Librarian, British Library.

Speakers on the theme "Looking after medieval manuscripts: problems of managing smaller collections" were Katy Hooper (Sydney Jones Library, Liverpool University); Dr Penny Bulloch, Balliol College, Oxford; Dr Rowan Watson (National Art Library, V&A)

At a meeting on 17 February 1993, Professor A.G. Watson, Daniel Huws and Professor A.C. De La Mare were co-opted by the Committee. The summer meeting will be the Annual General Meeting; membership will run by financial year - subscriptions will thus be due in April 1994.

The next meeting of the Association on exhibitions and exhibition catalogues will be on 5 July 1993 in London. The winter meeting will take place in Oxford on 16 December taking as the subject manuscripts held on deposit in repositories.

British Library

Recent acquisitions include the papers of Sir William Trumbull, Secretary of State (d.1716); letters of T.S. Eliot to the poet Anne Ridler, 1937-1960, and to Robert Waller, 1935-1952; the archive of Sir William Petty (1623-1687), purchased with the help of the NHMF; letters of John Churchill, 1st Duke of Marlborough to Anthonie [check spelling] Heinsius, Grand Pensionary of Holland, purchased with the help of the NHMF, the Shaw Fund and the Friends of the National Libraries; archive of Sir Horatio Walpole, 1st Baron Walpole of Wolterton (1678-1757), diplomatist, purchased with the help of the NHMF; manuscript of Grahame Greene's last novel, The Captain and the Enemy.

Cambridge University Library

Cambridge verses in Latin, Greek and Hebrew presented to Queen Elizabeth I on her visit to the University in 1564 (Add. 8915), purchased with the help of many Cambridge colleges and the V and A fund; letters to Siegfried Sassoon (Sotheby's sale-cat., 14 December 1992, lot 119; Add. 8889/4); two diaries of John Neville Keynes (father of Maynard Keynes and Sir Geoffrey Keynes), for 1877-80, were presented to add to those already in the library (Add. 7831); four volumes of autograph correspondence of John Willis Clark (1833-1910), purchased (Add. 8952-8955); compilation of Boethius and other texts in the hand of Lorenzo Traversagni, written at Toulouse in 1460 (Add. 8957); music MSS. including orchestral sections by Sir William Walton for Laurence Olivier's film of Hamlet (Add. 8927).

National Library of Wales

The purchase of 55 manuscripts from the Brogyntyn Collection included the <u>Liber Epistolaris</u> of Richard de Bury, c.1324-5; a 15th century MS containing 55 Middle English texts (among them the ony known medieval copy of the metrical romance "Sir Gawain and the Carle of Carlisle"; a 15th century manuscript containing "The Pricke of Conscience" and other Middle English verse; the Brogyntyn Lute Book, c.1575 containing a collection of Elizabethan lute music.

Other accessions include a pedigree roll showing the descent of William Lloyd of Halghton, co. Flint, 1602; a mid-17th century pedigree book showing the Welsh ancestry of James I; papers of Professor Gwyn Jones (b.1907).

National Library of Scotland

Recent acquisitions include papers of Robert Stevenson & Sons, civil engineers, late 18th - 20th centuries, with a notebook of Robert Louis Stevenson containing drafts of poems and other work; papers

of Kenneth White, including typescripts, proofs of poems, essays, short stories, autobiography and travel works, c.1963-1992.

Trinity College, Dublin

Recent major accessions include correspondence and papers of Liam De Róiste (1882-1959), politician, author and lecturer; papers of Susan Mitchell (1866-1926), poet and editor; volume of sketches and stories of Daniel Charles Grose (d.1839), topographical artist and author; letters of J.M. Synge (1871-1909), playwright, mostly to Molly Allgood; papers of Oliver St John Gogarty (1878-1957); records of the Royal Zoological Society of Ireland, 1836-c.1953.

Durham University Library

Five volumes from the residue of the library of Lord William Howard (1563-1640) from Naworth Castle, Cumbria (Sotheby's, 14 Dec. 1992, lot 171), were acquired with the help of substantial grants from the V&A Purchase Grant Fund, the Friends of the National Libraries and the NHMF. Arranged under subject headings and described in the auction catalogue as commonplace books, they are rather an individual's own compositions in Latin and in English. Included is a copy of a hitherto unknown letter to Sir Philip Sidney (1554-86), in the handwriting of Henry Howard (1540-1614).

NATIONAL HERITAGE MEMORIAL FUND

Up to 20 May 1993, the Fund had made contributions to: the University of Durham for the library of Lord William Howard, with some manuscript material (£21,168); the National Library of Scotland for the business archives and library of the civil engineering firm of Robert Stevenson (1722-1850) (£75,000); the National Library of Wales for the Brogyntyn MSS; the British Library, for the Sir William Petty Papers, paid in two instalments (£500,000 + £191,178).

PURCHASE GRANT FUND

The Fund, administered for the Museums and Galleries Commission by the V&A, is designed to help repositories not directly funded by the government. In April 1992, the part of the Fund reserved for manuscripts was raised to £70,000. The lower price limit at which manuscript material is elegible is £350, and the maximum grant possible from the Manuscripts Vote £12,000. Grants can also be made from the Main Fund for the acquisition of manuscript materials.

In the financial year 1992-3, 33 applications were made, of which 24 were successful. The average grant was £7,140 (against c.£5,000 in 1991-2). Grants made from the Manuscript Fund, and grants made from the Main Fund for manuscripts, totalled £171,365, allowing purchases of £517,988 to be made.

Between August 1992 and April 1993, the following grants were made for the purchase of manuscripts and archives: journal and album of Grebfell family of Taplow, 1864-1909 (Buckinghamshire Record Office); volume of verse presented to Elizabeth I by Cambridge University (Cambridge University Library); "Reality Studio" Archive, 1978-1988 (Brynmor Jones Library, University of Hull); manuscript of verse and prose by Joshua Barnes, 1708 (Brotherton Library, Leeds University); Enitharmon archive, 1967-1987 (Brotherton Library, Hull University); letters of bishop William Lloyd, 1664-1707 (Lambeth Palace Library); letters from George Orwell, 1911-12 (University College London Library); tobacconist's ledgers and account books, 1705-1975 (Westminster City Libraries); diaries and correspondence of 6th Earl Winterton, 1891-1975 (Bodleian Library, Oxford); Mostyn Owen family and estate papers, 15th - 19th centuries (Shropshire Record Office); Vyvyan of Trelowarren papers, 17th - 19th centuries (Cornwall County Record Office).

(Cornwall Record Office); library of Lord William Howard (Durham University Library); the Brownlow archive (Lincolnshire Archives); the Molyneux papers (Nottingham University Library).

EDWARD THOMAS MANUSCRIPTS: 'THE LATTERMATH'

In 1992, as reported in <u>Newsletter</u> no.22, the National Library of Wales acquired some papers of the poet Edward Thomas; slightly to its surprise, the library became the prime collection of the poet's papers before the end of the year.

In 1916, Edward Thomas burned most of his papers. Most of what survived remained in the family until about 1960 when Helen Thomas sold much of what she had kept. One large group of notebooks went to the Berg Collection, New York Public Library. Another group, which included Edward Thomas's diaries and the greater part of the correspondence between Edward and Helen, disappeared from view. These manuscripts were bought by the National Library of Wales in 1981, on condition that the sale should not be made public for ten years. At the beginning of 1992, as NLW was preparing to announce its acquisition (TLS, 20 March 1992), the Edward Thomas Fellowship initiated and supported the purchase from America by the library of the correspondence of Edward Thomas and James Ashcroft Noble, Helen's father.

A few weeks later, the poet's grandson, Edward Cawston Thomas, offered the National Library of Wales two pocket books in which Edward Thomas had written the early drafts of many of his poems, sigla M_1 and M_2 in the Oxford Collected Poems. None of the surviving manuscripts take us closer than these to the creation of the poetry. This gift was followed by another when David Thomas, nephew of the poet, gave the largest surviving group of typescripts of the poems, the group identified as II in the Collected Poems. "The Welsh have reason to be hesitant in claiming as one of their own a poet so deeply in love with the English countryside. But his own conscious Welshness found an echo last year when Myfanwy Thomas wrote of the wonderful news of the homing to Wales' of her father's papers". (Daniel Huws).

CONWAY LIBRARY: PHOTOGRAPH COLLECTIONS

The Conway Library at the Courtauld Institute has recently suffered a severe cut in funding and has launched an appeal for financial support. An invaluable source for the student of both Western medieval and Byzantine manuscripts, the Conway photographic collection has good coverage of most of the major British public - and many private - collections. Manuscript sales at Sotheby's and Christie's have been photographed for the collection since the 1960s. In 1987, the Emmett Publishing Co. published the collection as part of the Conway Library microfiche series. Donations will be welcomed. Conway staff are organising study days and tours based on art historical themes. Details from the Conway Librarian, Courtauld Institute, Somerset House, Strand, London WC2R 0RN.

The Warburg Institute photographic collection also has holdings of reproductions of medieval manuscripts, useful not only for the student of iconography, but also for those interested in codicological research. Like the Conway, the Warburg photographic collection is badly in need of funds. The Warburg Institute appeal is still active.

THE NATIONAL MANUSCRIPTS CONSERVATION TRUST

The annual report for 1992 has been published. Copies are available from Mrs S Kenna, British Library, Research and Development Department, 2 Sheraton Street, London W1V 4BH. The next closing date for applications is 1 October 1993. A small travelling exhibition which illustrates the work of the trust and some of the projects supported is now available for loan on application to Mrs Kenna.

MANUSCRIPTS IN MICROFORM

Altair Publishing, Todmorden, Lancs., are issuing a number of collections of trading records in British repositories. Already published are Minutes and other records of the East India Association, 1812-14 and 1829-7 (7 reels \$300) and Minutes of the West India Association, 1807-1969 (5 reels \$220), both from the Archives of the Mitchell Library, Glasgow. A number of sets of Liverpool maritime and trading records are projected.

Research Publications' project Darwin, Huxley and the natural sciences reaches unit three with The Charles Darwin papers from the Cambridge University Library (34/35 reels \$2950).

Scholarly Resources Inc. act as authorized distributors of U.S.National Archives microfilms. Recent publications include Letters received by the Headquarters of the Army (139 reels \$3,197), and the Bush-Conant File relating to the development of the Atomic Bomb, 1940-45 (14 reels \$322).

University Publications of America have issued The Papers of John D. Rockefeller, Sr. (66 reels \$5955). The collection is available in parts 1, Business correspondence, 1877-93; 2, Business investments correspondence, 1881-93; and 3, Office correspondence, 1879-94 (\$1,235, \$950, and \$3,990, with printed guides). Also from UPA comes The Papers of George C. Marshall: Selected World War II correspondence (40 reels \$6,465).

World Microfilms announce The Minutes of the Presbyterian Fund 1827-99 (6 reels \$250) and the Correspondence of Revd. William Baxter (1615-91) (3 reels \$140), both of these from Dr. Williams's Library, London. The project Records of Livery Companies and related organisations at the Guildhall Library now includes Haberdashers Records 1583-1979 (91 reels \$3,600), the Company of Musicians Minutes, etc, 1712-1912 (4 reels \$150), Watermen and Lightermen's Company ... records 1688-1971 (85 reels \$3,400), and Society of Apothecaries records, etc. 17th-20th cent. (68 reels \$2,600).
